Our first real vacation together. . .drove over and back. We drove a Northern route there and took a Southern route back to view different parts of each state.


Alternated every other night: motel for Patricia and camping for me.

Yellowstone is a wonder, and beautiful place.





























THE **Grand Can**yon may be longer and deeper, but, the colors in Yellowstone take the prize











































Lewis & Clark Caves


In Wyoming, before you get to Yellowstone.
Climbing up to the top of a hill, and then down through the bowels of the hill to come out at the bottom.





































This is what Yellowstone is currently working towards after the fires, a totally different ecosystem.






















There used to be five of these petrified trees. After tourists had chipped four down to nothing for souvenirs, they placed the fence around the last one.
























Though to be fair, we didn't get up into them, which might have made a difference. You can tell if you look down the center that this is two pics patched together.









































