

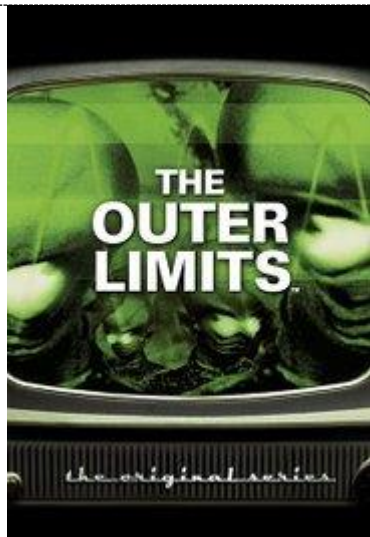

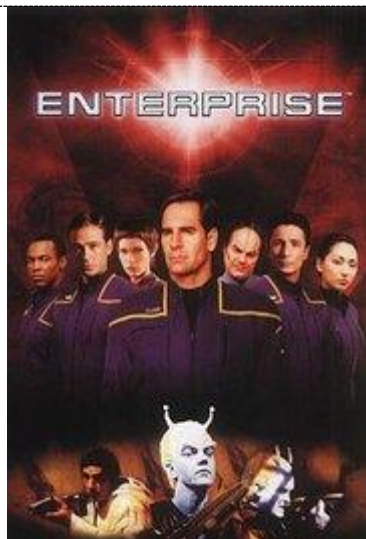

TOS was low budget, so they had to depend on acting and stories, over special effects.

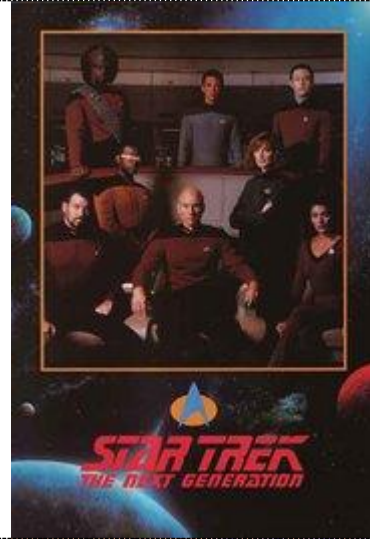
